


2022 CROP Vienna Hunger Walk— October 2nd







Why Catholics Should Care for Our Common Home

Pope Francis called on Catholics to embrace the urgent challenge to protect the whole human family and all of creation in the encyclical Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home. The Diocese of Arlington Peace and Justice Commission will address how to do so at a special Mass and conference Saturday, September 17, at the Church of the Nativity, Burke, "Why should I Care for Our Common Home? Conversion, Prayer, and Action." The event will launch the Diocese's seven-year effort to teach and implement Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home. Bishop Michael F. Burbidge will celebrate 5 p.m. Mass, followed by dinner, then a 6:45 p.m. keynote address by Dan Misleh, founder of the Catholic Climate Covenant. A panel of Catholic community leaders will discuss how to implement the encyclical on the integral ecology of God's creation in families, schools, and communities. 

HOME REPAIRS FOR THE ELDERLY — The Home Repair for the Elderly Program provides minor home repairs and/or accessibility modifications to eligible low- and moderate-income elderly and individuals with disabilities for homes in which they are currently residing. These *minor* repairs can often make a *major* difference when it comes to protecting their investment and maintaining their independence. Fairfax County provides a crew to do up to one week's worth of labor and up to \$1,000 in materials, all completely free of charge to eligible homeowners. HELP FOR DISABLED DRIVERS — There's a new app that helps drivers with disabilities fill their gas tanks. For adults living with a disability, a simple task like filling your tank at a gas station can be a challenge. An app called fuelService is now available to help. Individuals can use the app to see find a gas station that can assist them, then fuelService tells the station when the individual has arrived, and lets the driver know the wait time for assistance. The fuelService app is free of charge for the user, both to download and use. All costs are paid by fuel companies, and proceeds benefit research into curing paralysis from spinal cord injuries.
