Christmas Mass Schedule: Prior to 2016, the two early Christmas Eve Masses were ticketed only to School and CCF families, and there were overflow Masses in DeSales Hall. In 2017, we opened up the Masses to all parishioners and added an additional Christmas Eve Mass. However, because of the significant demand to attend these Masses, signup was still required for every person, and there were no overflow Masses. The church and parking lot have limited capacity per Mass. In 2019, we did not have a ticket system, which proved NOT to be a success. The number of people in the Church was over capacity limits, and getting into and out of Mass was highly unsafe in the Narthex and in the parking lot. During COVID, we used SignUpGenius for signing up for Mass, and it went exceptionally well, so we will be using that process again this year.

Signup will be on a first-come, first-served basis for ALL Masses. The link to signup was sent to all parishioners and went live on Dec. 13th at 9 am. The signup will then be open to non-parishioners on Monday, December 20th and will be posted on the website at <u>www.olgcva.org/liturgy-worship/christmas</u>.

Parish Updates

OLGC Inclement Weather Policy: Please check webpage for updates. In case of inclement weather, we follow the Fairfax County Public Schools schedule, which is announced on TV, radio, and <u>www.fcps.edu</u>. We will also post the announcement on the school and church websites. This includes closures, delayed openings, or afternoon/evening activities being canceled.

<u>On full closure days</u>, OLGC will follow the announcement and take the day off as a snow day. If inclement weather days become numerous or run consecutively, the decision for OLGC School to eLearn will be made by the OLGC Administrative Team and that decision will be

communicated to OLGC School families via email and text. Announcements will also be posted on the school website. When OLGC School is closed, all activities on campus are canceled for the entire day, except for the celebration of Mass (the church will be closed after Mass). All are advised to use extreme caution when making the decision about attending Mass and keep in mind your personal safety and the safety of others. If you decide to attend Mass, please enter through the Niblick entrance. The lower parking lot and bell tower lot will be plowed first.

All Zoom scheduled classes, meetings, and activities will take place no matter the weather, as long as the facilitator has electricity and internet.

<u>On 2-hour delay days</u>, OLGC School will follow the announcement and open at 10am. Students may be dropped off no earlier than 9:30am and we will follow the inclement weather carpool process. OLGC Church offices will open at 11am and any activities scheduled after that time will proceed as scheduled.

If FCPS is not in session on an inclement weather day, OLGC will make the decision. OLGC School parents will receive an email message from OLGC on school days and announcements will also be posted on the school and church websites. You can sign up for <u>FCPS News You Choose</u> to subscribe and receive emails of Delayed Openings and School Closings. Due to the speed of updating, the official <u>@FCPSnews Twitter</u> account is generally the first and fastest mode of communication.

Lois Steffensen had been a parishioner since 1969 and was active with the widowers' support group and is an example of someone who exemplified Live Jesus! After her graduation from St. Regis College, a Catholic women-only college at the time, she taught second grade for one year. As a military spouse, she became an expert at creating a new home for her family in each of the 17 locations (both in the US and abroad) to which her husband was assigned throughout his career with the US Air Force. After his death, she was proud to have lived independently in Vienna and was a dedicated volunteer at Fairfax Hospital for 25 years, logging 4,258 hours of service. Given her abiding Catholic

faith and half-century attendance at OLGC, her family knew a gift to OLGC would be a loving tribute. Because of her interest in education, the gift went toward tuition for an elementary-aged student.



A REFLECTION ON CHRISTMAS - I'm not sure many have had the same experience that's been mine each December as we wait for the day of Jesus's birth. Every year the strongest memories I have of this time are those of my childhood. It was a magical month of anticipation and preparation. Santa Claus figured pretty heavily in my early years until my mother, totally out of patience with my expectations, told me at about 2 pm on December 24, that there was no Santa Claus. I was devastated. (She could have waited until July, right?) Since then, I've been wistful, loving the idea of this magical figure who showed up with presents.

Aside from that, I remember that there was much, much less "hype:" about Christmas. There were only a couple of gifts per person under the tree. In the 1930's, as our country tried to work its way out of the Great Depression, there wasn't much money to be had. In our house a sense of reverence and holiness was in the air. We had solemn traditions that went back generations in the family, which I observe in my own home to this day.

When I was downsizing, the very thought of disposing of our large collection of Christmas ornaments broke my heart. They represented my husband's and my life together, a new one purchased every year, chosen to commemorate a special event; so many memories! I left the disposal task to the end, and saved the most precious ornaments – the very few that survived both of our childhoods up to now and the ones made by our children and grandchildren. There are paper stars, thread spools covered with foil that became bells, the half of a walnut shell with a bit of greenery, an intricate paper swan stapled together, and a fancy 4-sided paper ornament that's become a bit lopsided over the years.

All of this reminded me of the piece written years ago by American Humorist Erma Bombeck. Called "The Chimes", it makes my heart sing. You've seen it here before, but it bears repeating.

"Everything is in readiness. The tree is trimmed. The cards taped to the doorframe. The boxes stacked in glittering disarray under the tree. Why don't I hear chimes? Remember the small boy who made the chimes ring in a fictional story years ago? As the legend went, the chimes would not ring unless a gift of love was placed on the altar. Kings and men of great wealth placed untold jewels on the altar, but year after year the church remained silent.

Then one Christmas Eve a small child in a tattered coat made his way down the aisle, and without anyone noticing he took off his coat and placed it on the altar. The chimes rang out joyously throughout the land to mark the loving gift of a small boy. I used to hear chimes. I heard them the year one of my sons gave me a tattered piece of construction paper on which he had crayoned two hands folded in prayer and a moving message, "Oh, come holy spit!"

I heard them the year I got a shoebox that held two baseball cards, and the gum was still with them. I heard them the Christmas they all got together and cleaned the garage.

They're all gone, aren't they? The years of the lace doilies fashioned into snowflakes, the hands traced in plaster of paris, the Christmas trees made of pipe cleaners, the thread spools that held small candles. They're gone. The chubby hands that clumsily used up two dollars' worth of paper to wrap a cork coaster are sophisticated enough to take a number and have the gift wrapped professionally. The childish decision of when to break the ceramic piggy bank with a hammer to spring the 59 cents is now resolved by a credit card. The muted thump of pajama-covered feet padding down the stairs has given way to the click of her knee-high fashion boots.

It'll be a good Christmas. We'll eat too much. Make a mess in the living room. Throw the warranties into the fire by mistake. Drive the dog crazy, taping bows to his tail. Return cookies to the plate with a bite out of them. Listen to Christmas music.

But, Lord, what I would give to bend low and receive a gift of toothpicks and library paste and hear the chimes one more time." (Erma Bombeck) Often the smallest, simplest things in life mean the most.' Merry Christmas!
