EXPLORE: Adam and Eve disobeyed God, thereby injuring their relationship with God and each other (Genesis 3 on p. 21); Because of this first sin, we are born into original sin; Salvation is the forgiveness of sins and the restoration of friendship with God, which comes through Jesus; We say "Lord, have Mercy" during the penitential rite of the Mass. REFLECT: Act of Hope prayer (p. 24). RESPOND: Write a sentence or two about what you will do this week to improve your relationship with God and with
