Others (CHO). This month, Faith Formation is the host. The High School WorkCampers will be handing out order forms for Mulch Sales and will be available to explain their trip.





Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues Tuesdays Feb 25th - April 7th During the Season of Lent, our Tuesday Scripture Study will be exploring Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues. Join Bishop Robert Barron for this presentation of the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. 





ABOUT LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE – There are so many different long-term care policies on the market, sometimes it becomes overwhelming. Whether you have such a policy, or whether you're considering purchasing one, here are some key terms to consider when looking at policy documents.

Benefit Amount. Often this is provided as a per-day amount for services covered under the policy, but some policies will provide it as a monthly aggregate. Nursing homes generally charge using a daily rate, so it's fairly easy to understand how much of the daily charge will be covered by long-term care insurance. The approximate daily rate for nursing home private care in Virginia is \$283 per day but this can vary widely depending on a number of factors.

Policy Lifetime Maximum Benefit. Generally, long-term care policies will cap the aggregate amount of coverage to a specified dollar figure. The maximum benefit limit is the total that the insurance carrier will pay over the life of the policy. Usually, the higher the lifetime maximum, the higher the premium.

Types of Coverages. Often people think of long-term care services as synonymous with nursing home care, and in the case of Medicaid long-term care, that is all that is covered. Private, long-term care insurance policies often cover many more services, including assisted living (not covered by Medicaid) and home care. Some possible services a policy may include are: nursing home, assisted living facility, home and community-based care, homemaker services, durable medical equipment, care coordinator, respite care, hospice care, and alternate plan of care (this could include rehabilitation).

Waiting/Elimination Period. Many policies have a period of time that you'll need to receive care or services covered under the policy but during which time no benefits will be paid before the policy will start to provide coverage. The waiting time may vary depending on the policy and often those days may be covered by another policy or Medicare and will still count toward the elimination period. Activities of Daily Living. Most policies require that before benefits are paid, you need assistance with at least two activities of daily living (ADLs), or that there be cognitive impairment. ADLs include bathing, dressing, toileting, transferring, continence and eating. Eligibility for Medicaid generally requires that the applicant be unable to perform four ADLs, or have some level of cognitive impairment. Therefore, long-term care insurance covers services far earlier than Medicaid.

Home and Community-Based Care. What this covers will vary significantly from policy to policy. Some policies may cover the care a family member provides, while others explicitly will not. Some cover homemaker type services, physical therapy, occupational therapy and a range of other services and supports. This can be a significant benefit to the insured, so it's important to understand these services fully when purchasing long-term care insurance or using it.

While these brief descriptions don't tell the whole story, they're helpful as a good start to understanding how this type of insurance works. (Many thanks to Elder Law attorney Susan K. Pollack of Needham Mitnick & Pollack, PLC.)

FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION ASSISTANCE – AARP'S

TaxAide program offers assistance to low and moderate-income taxpayers, not just the elderly, and AARP membership isn't required. IRS-certified volunteers prepare both Federal and State returns and electronically file them free of charge. The AARP TaxAide site closest to OLGC is Sun Trust Bank of Vienna (near Anita's and Karen's Florist), 515 Maple Avenue. Use the entrance on the side of the bank building and take the elevator to the third floor. Beginning tomorrow, February 3, they will be open for business on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10 am-2 pm (closed February 17). Due to space constraints, the site will not be open on Thursdays this year.


