Anointing of the Sick: at all Masses March 19-20th, Sat 4pm, Sun 8am, 10am, 12pm, 5pm

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick. This grace helps the whole person, not only to bear the suffering but also to quiet anxiety, dissipate fear, and inspire confidence in God and acceptance of his will. When the Sacrament is celebrated communally, those who are sick, experiencing the frailty of old age, recovering from addictions, or preparing for a serious medical procedure, come before the community in faith to be anointed with the Oil of the Infirm and prays over them. The community, in a solemn prayer of faith, intercedes for those who are being anointed and prays for healing and body, mind, and soul.



Synod Listening Session: Sun. March 27th at 1:30pm in DeSales Hall. Pope Francis has invited the Catholic Church



throughout the world to participate in preparations for the next Synod of Bishops in Rome, in October 2023. Everyone in the Diocese of Arlington is invited to participate in the Diocesan Synodal Phase, which will involve in-person Listening Sessions at the local level: in parishes, at universities and schools, at Catholic Charities, and at other locations. The fundamental question to be considered is this: A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together," by proclaiming, celebrating, and living the Gospel as we make our way to the Promised Land of Heaven. How is this "journeying together" happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take to grow in "journeying together"? Through the synodal process,

the people of the Diocese of Arlington, along with the whole Church throughout the world, will grow in deepening our commitment to proclaiming, celebrating, and living the Gospel.

AGING IN PLACE – This topic seems to be gaining in popularity. Earlier this month a presentation on this subject was announced for this past week at the Vienna Community Center. In a recent issue of the Washington Post, the Spotlight on Senior Living featured an article about it. Here's an adaptation of that article that I hope will be helpful.

We're fortunate in this day and age that there are many residential options available to us as we grow older and our needs change. That being said; however, most of us would still prefer to remain in our own home. A WebMD and eldercare experts' survey showed almost 90% of adults age 50 and older prefer to age in place. So, what's fueling this decision? What are the benefits of aging in place? According to RetirementLiving.com, remaining in your own home costs less than assisted living or nursing fees; is more comfortable, slows the rate of memory loss, strengthens your social network, and allows you to be more independent. Note that this doesn't include Independent Living in a retirement community.

Take it one step at a time. It may seem overwhelming, but making changes and improvements to your home can be done in stages. Begin with the rooms you use most and think about any challenges you already have. AARP's HomeFit Guide provides many ways to make your home comfortable and safe. Among the top causes of accidental injuries at home are falls, fires, and burns. Falls are the leading injury-related cause of death for seniors. Installing slip-resistant flooring, anti-scald valves, grab bars as well as a fire extinguisher near the kitchen will all go a long way in ensuring your safety.

The National Council on Aging also offers suggestions for making your home a safe space in which to continue to live as you get older. Don't use area rugs, and make sure that all carpeting is securely attached to the floor. Replace

handles on doors and faucets with ones that are comfortable to use. Install grab bars near toilets and in the shower and tub. Reduce fall hazards by adding non-skid mats or no-slip strips on floors or surfaces that can get wet. Put light switches at the top and bottom of staircases and use night lights. When modifying your home, don't overlook aging in place home automation, also known as assistive domotics. Home technology for the elderly or disabled can make your home safer and give you peace of mind when making the decision to age in place.

The website https://ageinplace.com points out that home technology can be beneficial in a number of areas such as health care (medication reminders, daily medical testing, medical consultations), long-distance caregiving (coordination, communication, preventing loneliness), home safety (fall prevention, security, lighting), as well as entertainment, activities, and games (Wordle, anyone?). Making modifications to your home is just one aspect of being able to successfully age in place. Other considerations include managing illnesses or injuries, personal care, household chores, meals, transportation, money management, maintaining personal relationships with family and friends, and finding activities. That's a lot.

But help is available. There are many resources available to help you address these concerns. Some suggestions are to reach out to family, friends, and neighbors who can help you get what you need. Find out about community and local government resources from health care providers, social workers, your local Agency on aging, and clergy. Talk to geriatric care managers who can be especially helpful in coming up with a plan if family members don't live nearby. Explore Federal Government resources for seniors. Contacting the Administration for Community Living is a good starting point. Make a financial plan. Some services you might need may be free, others not. Some may be covered by Medicare, but again, others not.

Check out https://www.benefits.gov to find out about possible benefits you might qualify for. You may also be eligible for benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs which might be able to provide medical care in your home as well as homemaker/home health aide services, adult day health care, and hospice. Visit www.va.gov, call the VA Health Care Benefits at, 877-222-8387 or contact the VA medical center nearest you.
