





HELP NEEDED AT THE POLLS – The Fairfax County Office of Elections needs additional bilingual election officers to assist voters in the June primary and November general elections. Specifically, registered Virginia voters who speak Vietnamese and English fluently or Korean and English fluently are needed to serve in the areas of Annandale, Centreville, Chantilly, and Falls Church.

You'll perform all regular election officer duties, including assisting most voters in English, but will be assigned to precincts with a significant number of voters who may primarily speak Vietnamese or Korean. To serve as a designated bilingual election officer, you must also complete a short oral language skills assessment. Fairfax County is the largest voting jurisdiction in Virginia, with 247 primaries countywide. It takes thousands of enthusiastic and trained election officers to ensure that it will be an efficient and well-run election. Compensation begins at \$175, and training is provided online for new officers. To apply, go to https://www.vote4fairfax.com/apply

(be sure to indicate if you speak Vietnamese or Korean). **FYI: SECOND COVID BOOSTER** – The FDA authorized, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends a second booster dose of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine for people 50 and older and those 18-49 who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine as both their primary series dose and the booster dose. Individuals in these groups may choose to receive the second booster if at least four months have passed since their first booster dose.

Second booster doses are available from pharmacies, healthcare providers, as well as the Fairfax County Government Center. You can find other locations at <u>www.vaccines.gov</u>.
