The Season of Lent: The Church tells us...


"For by your gracious gift each year, your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure, so that, more eagerly intent on prayer and on the works of charity, and participating in the mysteries by which we have been reborn, they may be led to the fullness of grace that you bestow on your sons and daughters" (Preface I of Lent).

"The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and Baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Catechumens are led to the Sacraments of Initiation by means of the Rite of Election, the Scrutinies, and catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the Word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their Baptismal Promises" (Ceremonial of Bishops, 249).

Brochures with the full schedule of opportunities this Lent to enter more fully into our renewal, both as individuals and as a Community, will be emailed to every parish family. Additional brochures, in both Spanish and English, along with other Lenten materials, will available in the bookracks as you enter the church.

Norms for Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, February 26th and Good Friday, April 10th are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and Catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Initiation into the Church or the renewal of Baptismal Promises at Easter.








Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues Tuesdays Feb 25th - **April 7th** During the Season of Lent, our Tuesday Scripture Study will be exploring Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues. Join Bishop Robert Barron for this presentation of the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness.

"La celebración anual de la Cuaresma es la temporada especial para el ascenso a la montaña sagrada de Pascua. A través de su doble tema de arrepentimiento y bautismo, la temporada de Cuaresma dispone tanto a los catecúmenos como a los fieles para celebrar el misterio pascual. Los catecúmenos son conducidos a los sacramentos de iniciación por medio del Rito de Elección, los Escrutinios y la catequesis. Los fieles, que escuchan más atentamente la Palabra de Dios y se dedican a la oración, están preparados mediante un espíritu de arrepentimiento para renovar sus Promesas Bautismales" (Ceremonial de los Obispos, 249).
