Mystery

Happy Advent! This weekend, we begin the new liturgical year and the Advent season. Frequently, Advent is emphasized as a season of anticipation, preparation, light and darkness, hope, promise and fulfillment in preparation for the two comings of Christ: his earthly life and his future coming in glory. Yet, we can also view Advent as our own living the Paschal Mystery of Christ's life, suffering death and resurrection.
