His daughter, who graduated from OLGC, told the story of her OLGC days when she asked her dad why he was not a lawyer or doctor like the parents of her friends. His response was to use a childhood image. He said that he was like Humpty Dumpty, helping to put people back together after the death of a loved one. I love that image. At only sixty-five, he brought much comfort and healing into the lives of others.
